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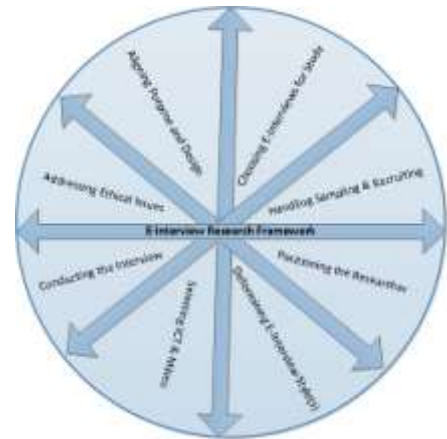

Cases in Online Interview Research is a selective collection of case studies and critiques. Ten researchers were invited to create case studies about interview research conducted with text-based or email, videoconference, multi-channel meeting or immersive technologies. Their cases offer the opportunity to scrutinize the inner workings of research design steps, decisions, joys, frustrations and discoveries. The international group of researchers represents diverse disciplines and use varied qualitative methodologies.

Each case is followed by two critiques: from a peer contributor and the editor. Critiques offer a sense of dialogue within the book, a dialogue readers can continue in their own discussions of the interplay of emerging technologies and emergent research.

The editor's analyses of each case, and metasynthesis of all cases in the final chapter, are based on her original *E-Interview Research Framework*. A Sage "Study Site" will contain sample syllabi, assignment ideas and discussion themes, and updated resources.
